

N.Y. scrap yard to star in National Geographic TV show

May 2 -- A Medford, N.Y., scrap yard is being featured on a new National Geographic Channel television show, "Break it Down."

Gershow Recycling's episode, "Break It Down: New York Scrap Yard," is scheduled to air at 10 p.m. eastern time May 5, the company said.

The episode is scheduled to re-air at 1 a.m. May 6 and 6 p.m. May 12.

The show will take viewers into Gershow Recycling, a 40-acre scrap yard on Long Island, according to National Geographic.

"In just one day, this family-run business will crush three million pounds of scrap -- including as many as 500 cars and 20 city buses -- to create a multimillion-dollar mound of steel. This family of scrap connoisseurs has only 10 hours to get the job done," according to a description of the show.
